
To The Beloved Brethren

RE: TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS FOR GROUPS AND SPECIAL MEETINGS


All Brethren travelling must commit themselves to regulation and control as follows:-

- Use of headsets to listen to movies or any worldly entertainment is a clear breach of our stand against the world.
- Brethren should abstain completely from visiting areas of worldly entertainment at airports, including bars and restaurants. No consumption of alcohol is to take place in public areas, unless in designated airline facilities where refreshments are provided by the airline company, or by the Brethren.
- Brethren may travel in suitable informal clothing if desired but need to be distinguished as Brethren and not appear as worldlings.
- Brethren should only attend an airport as specifically required under the direction of the responsible Travel Co-ordinator. Crowds of Brethren at airports are unsuitable, making ourselves unduly conspicuous and tending to encourage worldly behaviour.
- No cameras of any kind to be on display or used at airports.
- Airline staff should be spoken to in a respectful manner at all times; any discourteous behaviour is completely unsuitable. Airline and airport regulations must be respected.
- Luggage taken overseas and brought back home should be restricted. Baggage is not to exceed airline specification both in size and weight. Specifically, weight of checked luggage in any circumstances should not exceed 25kg per passenger.
- Brethren should respect and strictly adhere to arrival and departure times. Any missed flights could result in additional travel charges.
- Requests for extended time away should not be made except as approved of in special circumstances.

We are assured that Brethren universally will prove blessing, progress and enjoyment as we commit ourselves to the maintenance of the standard.
